President's Message

I've just returned from a week away visiting my husband's family in Chilliwack, BC, a smallish city about an hour or so east of Vancouver. Besides reminding me that BC weather may be warmer, but it isn't always pleasanter than ours, this trip made me think of 3 things related to our Temple Shalom Community.

- <u>Family</u>. Our family is not very big and is very scattered across Canada and the US; we have no relatives here in Winnipeg. This visit made me grateful for family, even a small and distant family. It also made me grateful for my "other" family; the people here in Winnipeg, many from Temple Shalom, some of whom we've known for only a short time and some for nearly 50 years, that are family here. These are the people we celebrate holidays (Jewish and secular) with; they are the people we mark life cycle events (both joyous and sad) with; they are the people we turn to when we need help or support.
- 2. <u>Talent and creativity</u>. Erwin comes from a family of very creative and talented people. I always find it stimulating and exciting to be around them and although I have neither their talent nor creativity, this often gives me ideas and energy that prods me to do something. Outside of family (perhaps I'm a bit biased), I cannot think of a more creative and talented group than Temple Shalom's congregants and how amazing it is that so many of you share those talents with the rest of us. This is the foundation of our vibrant congregation. Let me just give a few examples:

Artists and Crafters, Fund Raisers, Gardeners, Grant writers, Musicians, Planners, Prayer leaders, Teachers, Tech experts, Writers, And More.....

3. Like so many cities, Chilliwack's downtown has been on a downward trajectory for a long time. But things have changed recently, due to people who had a vision for a different future and changed the trajectory. There are many new residential and commercial buildings; they've developed a small European style "village" of shops, businesses and residences that is always busy; the City has put money towards public art totally changing the look of the downtown, this includes sculptural works and dozens and dozens of amazing murals on the sides of buildings, along laneways and even on garbage cans, painted by local, national and international artists. Temple Shalom is also in a period of revitalizing transformation. We're growing (albeit slowly); there are more young adults, newcomers and younger families joining and participating bringing their energy and new ideas (this is our present and also our future); there's more going on, and some of it is really fun like our recent Trivia night; our future Rabbi is excited about taking on her position with us in the summer; we're reviving and reimagining some of our committees/working groups; we're making the sanctuary more user-friendly and comfortable; we've planted a garden and been able to reach out to others; and that's just a taste.

There's a lot happening at Temple Shalom and many of you are already involved but if you're not, I hope you will find something we are already doing, or that you would like to initiate that will inspire you to become part of this move toward a vibrant future for Temple Shalom.




