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# Rabbi Allan's Message

Summer has arrived, the days are longer and our Temple goes quiet(er) for the next couple months. It's more than a coincidence and I'm not complaining because it actually might be a good thing. After all, life is intended to be about living life, and our religion or our religious and spiritual practices are meant to fuel that journey. And when our spiritual tanks are full, why not enjoy the experience?






# We are building a Free Little Library in the foyer of Temple Shalom.
