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President's Message

It's been a stressful month. Judaism offers us a list of "rules" or *mitzvot*, 613 to be precise, to assist us in facing both the good and the bad. So, this message is about *mitzvot*, not all of them, just a small subset of positive mitzvot, *Gemilut Chasadim*, acts of loving-kindness that focus on our relationships with other people. The joyous ones like celebrating with the bride and groom, welcoming guests, rejoicing in the birth of a baby are easy, but others are more difficult.

Some of these *mitzvot* are for the larger community. They may take a lot of time and energy and often involve working with others; think *Bal Tashheet* (avoiding waste), *Tikkun Olam* (repairing the world through actions and advocacy) and *Tzedakah* (providing for the less fortunate with financial donations, time and effort).

Other *mitzvot* such as *Bikur Cholim* (visiting the sick), *Kavod Hamet* (respecting the deceased) and *Nihum Avelim* (comforting the bereaved) are more personal and involve our interactions with only one or a few individuals.

Illness, whether physical or mental, makes us vulnerable, frightened and lonely. *Bikur Cholim* is important whether the illness is serious but brief and the patient is expected to recover, or is long, chronic and perhaps painful, and when recovery is less certain. In fact, *Bikur Cholim* can be critical to a patient's positive prognosis. Some people are fortunate; they have large families and circles of friends who provide, comfort, company and support. For others, that circle is smaller or missing, and the community must fulfil the mitzvah.

Judaism is a religion of life and not death; both *Bikur Cholim* and *Nihum Avelim* are mitzvot for the living. We easily forget the *mitzvah* of *Bikur Cholim* as we go about our daily activities, but the *mitzvot* around death have an immediacy and intensity which quickly mobilizes us. When a Jewish person dies, we ensure *Kavod Hamet*, that the deceased is "cared for" with respect. Members of the community may be responsible for preparing the body according to Jewish law (*Tahara*); those attending the funeral see the body on its final journey. We move seamlessly into *Nihum Avelim* once the burial is concluded supporting the bereaved during *Shiva* and beyond with food, company and prayer.

Temple Shalom is a caring community showing *Chesed*, compassion and loving-kindness. Do not forget the members of our "family" who are ill. In this age of technology, sometimes *Bikur Cholim* just requires a phone call, a facetime visit or a card or email. Remember that this is a mitzvah for the living and it rewards both the visitor and the person receiving the visit.




